GRANT COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION August 14, 2019

The Grant County Council met in regular session on Wednesday August 14, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

1. Call to order

President Middlesworth called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

6. Auditor's Report

Auditor Jim McWhirt expressed he has no comment on the all funds combined report. The summary report that shows the year to date and month of July official budgeted funds, no comment as well. The general fund balances comparison over the last few years up to date through July of 2019, the general fund cash balance is roughly 2 million higher than 2 years ago. Cash receipts for the general fund, we are roughly 900,000 ahead. Disbursements exceed 2018 by about 460,000. The cash receipts comparison, nothing new to report. The cash disbursement report comparing the budget to actual, notice the jail maintenance department has spent more than the budget in the year, we will have to do an additional appropriation at some point. The health insurance fund, the cash balance of the fund at the end of July 2019 is 813,000 higher than July of 2018. .

D. County Clerk- Clerk Pam Harris is asking to transfer \$1250 from Supplies to Equipment and \$515.75 from Office Supplies to General Equipment fund. Clerk Harris was not present, Brenda Russell presented the items. Councilman Roorbach made a motion to approve both items as requested. Second by Councilman Conner; motion carried 6-0.
